Talk Listen Change	Young People Using Harm towards Parents/Carers	The funding would enable us to increase our capacity to deliver our Respect Young People's Programme (RYPP) in Bury. The Programme supports young people aged 13 – 19 engaging in harmful behaviours towards their parents or carers. Young people and their parents/carers are supported by caring and non-judgemental professionals who use considered interventions including 1-1, group and peer support sessions to help them address challenges, increase self-awareness, make positive changes in their lives and develop safe, healthy and happy relationships. Bury Defence Academy	Knives Down Gloves Up	This is a 12 month project to disrupt youth crime and gang activity in East Bury and will support around 15 young people aged 11 – 18 who are either involved in or at risk of involvement in criminality or youth violence. Participants will be split into 2 groups (1 group engaged on Friday nights and the other on Saturday nights), offered a package of support to help them change their lives for the better. Red Rose Recovery	Standing Together in Recovery	Red Rose Recovery (RRR), a pioneering charity supporting individuals in recovery, presents Standing Together in Recovery, a 4-month programme delivering weekly peer-led sessions at our Bury hub. Led by our Lived Experience Support Worker, who is also a trained Hate Crime Ambassador, these sessions will unite individuals from diverse backgrounds, strengthening shared understanding and tackling stigma. Activities will focus on hate crime awareness, personal safety, and community connections, enhancing participants' confidence and inclusion.	Bury West	£2,461.20

Eagles Wing	Come as strangers, stay as friends	The Eagles Wing is a befriending support group made up of local people, asylum seekers and refugees. We rent rooms at the United Reformed Church in Bury on three mornings every week for a variety of activities. This project will enable us to rent an additional room on each morning for volunteers to assist, support and befriend newcomers to Bury.	Bury East	£1,750.00
Lancs T20 Superleague	Winter Cricket Academy	Our Winter Cricket Academy will engage boys and girls (U11, U13, and U17) from Bury, with a special focus on reaching isolated youth from all communities, especially BME communities, and troubled families. Through structured cricket coaching, the program aims to reduce antisocial behaviour (ASB), provide a positive alternative to street activity, and enhance community cohesion. By creating an inclusive, supportive environment, we will help participants develop essential skills, build self-confidence, and promote teamwork.	Bury East	£2,000.00

ADAB	Honouring Life - Community Managing Moments Project	“Honouring Life: Community Managing Moments” is a strategic partnership project with ADAB and Uplift Unite, offering Bury’s communities a vital new bereavement support service. Providing professionals and community leaders with essential information on local and national bereavement services, followed by a peer-led pilot for diverse participants, fostering community cohesion and lasting support. The initiative includes facilitator training for borough-wide expansion, creating accessible, self-sustainable bereavement care.	Boroughwide	£2,455.00
League of Curiosity	Hands Together: Building Community Cohesion Through Puppetry	‘Hands Together’ is a 12-month community project using puppetry and storytelling to bring people together, foster understanding to address hate crime. Through creative workshops and performances, participants from diverse backgrounds will collaborate to share stories, explore cultural heritage, and develop new skills. The project includes open community workshops, focused skills-building sessions, and two public performances at The Met Theatre.	Boroughwide	£8,780.00
Supporting Sisters	Together We Thrive	The "Together We Thrive" initiative aims to create a series of inclusive community events that bring people together, foster unity, and celebrate diversity. Fair Futures	Community Talk	Through conversation, reading, craft and discussion, participants within four activity groups will get to know each other and discuss positive and negative aspects of their lives in Bury. Trained group coordinators will introduce topics around community safety, hate crime and domestic violence, guide discussions and give participants the means to express themselves through talk, writing and creative media.
